

# Sample Lesson #1

## Map Skills: Using a Grid

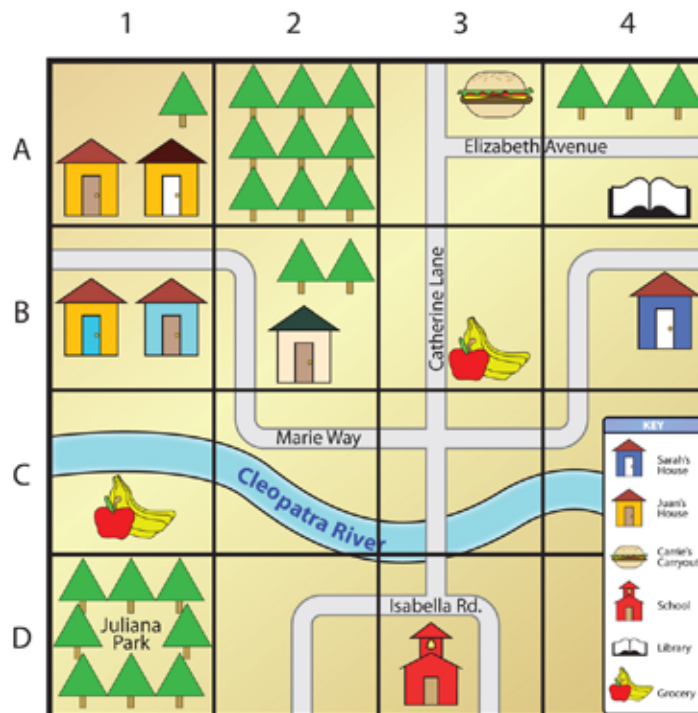
This map has **vertical** lines (going up and down) and **horizontal** lines (going side to side). The lines make a grid of boxes. A **grid** is another way to help you find places on a map.

Use the **map key** to find Sarah's House.

- Find the picture of Sarah's House on the map key.
- Then, find the picture of Sarah's House on the map.

Use the grid to find Sarah's House.

- Put one finger on letter B and another finger on number 4.
- Bring both fingers together (in between the grid lines) and you will land on Sarah's House.
- If you want to tell someone where Sarah's House is, you can say, "Look in B-4 on the grid."

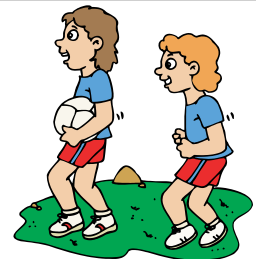
