Read these instructions for making a type of edible molding clay,\* and then answer the next five questions. (\*Do not use this recipe if you are allergic to peanuts.)

You can make a type of clay that is fun to play with and good to eat. First, wash your hands really well, and dry them with a clean towel. Then, combine one cup of smooth peanut butter, a tablespoon of soft margarine, and three-fourths of a cup of nonfat dry milk. Work the clay with clean hands until you have a smooth consistency. You can add more of the powdered milk if you want the clay to be firmer. Mold the clay into interesting shapes, and decorate your shapes with chocolate chips, raisins, flaked coconut, or candies. When you are finished, you can eat your creation! If you are playing with younger children, be sure to let them know that most kinds of clay are not for eating!
