
## Sample Lesson #1

1-3. When **c** is followed by **e**, **i**, or **y**, it usually has a **soft** sound. The **soft** sound of **c** sounds like **s**. **Examples**: face, cereal

When c is followed by a, o, or u, it has a hard sound. The hard sound of c sounds like k. Examples: carrot, cow
