# Help Pages Glossary

#### abolitionist

a person who worked to end slavery in the United States

#### absolute location

an exact position of a place on Earth as identified by its coordinates

#### aerospace

the industry that develops flight technology and manufactures airplanes, jets, blimps, and spacecraft

#### agriculture

the industry that includes growing crops, raising animals for food, and other aspects of farming

#### ally

a supporter

#### amendment

an addition or change to a document

#### ancestors

relatives who lived long ago

#### antebellum

the time before the Civil War

#### anti-slavery movement

the actions of people who worked to end slavery, including rallies, speeches, publications, and refusal to own slaves

#### appeal

a request to reverse the decision of another court

#### arsenal

a building where guns and military equipment are stored

#### artifact

an object created by humans; a cultural or historical item that tells something about people who lived long ago

#### assassin

someone who kills an important person or government figure, such as a president, for pay or because of strong beliefs

#### automotive industry

the industry that manufactures cars, trucks, vans, buses, and motorcycles and also produces engines and parts for these vehicles

#### baby boom

an 18-year period of time in US history marked by the birth of over 76 million babies (1946–1964)

#### bar graph

a graphic that uses bars of different heights or lengths to show information

#### barter

to trade goods and services instead of using money

#### bill

a draft of a proposed law

#### black lung disease

an illness of the lungs caused by inhaling coal dust

#### **Bluegrass**

part of Kentucky's nickname; a type of country music played on stringed instruments such as banjo, quitar, and fiddle

#### bluegrass

a type of meadow grass that sprouts bluish-purple buds in springtime

#### border state

a state that allowed slavery but fought to preserve the Union during the Civil War

#### boundary

a border of a defined geographic location

#### bounty

a sum of money given as a reward for capturing and turning in a fugitive

#### boycott

a refusal to buy or use a product; an action taken in order to force a change

#### brand

a design that sends a message about a product or place; may include a graphic (diagram/picture) and words

#### cabinet

a group that advises the president

#### canal

a waterway dug by humans

#### capital resource

the equipment, buildings, tools, and machines that workers use to produce goods and provide services

#### cardinal directions

the four main compass points: north, east, south, west

#### cash crop

a crop that is grown to be sold rather than used by the farmer

#### central government

the federal government; the government of a whole country

#### chronological order

the order in which events happen from first to last

#### civil rights

freedoms guaranteed equally to all citizens

#### class

a group of people that share the same economic or social standing

#### colony

a settlement ruled by a far-off country; people who live there are called colonists

#### commerce

the buying and selling of goods and services

#### company town

a town near a mine, built and run by a mining company

#### compass rose

a design used on maps to show direction

#### competition

the effort of two or more persons or businesses to get the same resources or sell to the same consumers

#### compromise

an agreement, or give-and-take, between two sides; each side is willing to give up something in order to get something

#### Confederacy

the Confederate States of America, the states that seceded from the United States

#### conflict

disagreement; a clash between people

#### congress

a group of representatives who make laws for their constituents

#### conservation

protecting the plants and animals that make up the natural environment

#### constituent

a citizen served by a representative

#### constitution

a written plan for government

#### consumer

a person who buys or uses goods and services

#### cooperation

the practice of working well together

#### coordinates

points on a globe or map where latitude lines cross (intersect with) longitude lines

#### county

a political division within a state; an area that is usually bigger than a city but smaller than a state

#### credit

the ability of a customer to get goods and services without money, with the promise of paying later

#### culture

a way of life; the language, food, beliefs, customs, and celebrations of a particular group

#### **Cumberland Gap**

a narrow pass through the Appalachian Mountains used by Native Americans and settlers as a passageway; a place where Kentucky, Virginia, and Tennessee meet

#### debate

a discussion between two sides who disagree; both sides have the chance to talk about what they believe

#### debt

something owed, usually money

#### deep shaft mine

a mine dug far into the earth

#### delegate

a representative chosen by a group of people to speak and act on their behalf

#### demand

how much of a good or service consumers are buying

#### deplete

to reduce or use up

#### discrimination

unfair treatment of people, especially on the grounds of race, country of origin, age, or gender

#### earthworks

structures made of earth (soil), for example, prehistoric mounds

#### economics

the study of how people use limited resources to meet their needs and satisfy their wants

#### economy

the ways a state or region makes and spends money

#### elector

person responsible for choosing leaders

#### elevation

the height of the land compared to the level of the ocean (sea level)

#### emancipate

to set free or release from someone's control

#### employee

a person who is paid to work for an employer (another person or company); a human resource

#### employer

a person or company that pays people to do work

#### **Equator**

the latitude line at zero degrees (0°); divides Earth into the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere

#### erosion

the movement of soil and rock from one place to another by wind or water

#### executive branch

the branch of government that enforces laws passed by the legislative branch

#### executive order

an order that comes straight from the president (not through Congress); similar to a law

#### export

a good sold and shipped out of the state or country where it is produced

#### federal government

the central or national government; the government of the whole country

#### fertile

rich in nutrients; good for growing crops

#### finance

matters related to money and how it is spent or saved

#### flint

a hard rock used for making tools and arrowheads

#### forestry

developing or managing forests, often as a source of timber

#### fort

a building with high walls made for protection

#### fossil

an imprint or the remains of an organism that lived at least 10,000 years ago

#### fossil fuel

coal, natural gas, or petroleum; a natural resource that formed hundreds of millions of years ago from decaying plants and animals

#### found

to create, establish, or take steps to build

#### framework

a set of ideas or rules that gives support to something

#### freedom of religion

the freedom to practice any religion or no religion

#### freedom of speech

the freedom to express an opinion without fear of punishment

#### freedom of the press

the freedom to write and publish facts and opinions

#### frontier

the edge of a settled region and the area beyond that settled region

#### fugitive

a person who has escaped; a runaway

#### **General Assembly**

Kentucky's legislative branch of government

#### geography

the study of Earth's surface and its characteristics

#### good

an item for sale

#### government

the group that makes laws and runs communities

#### **Great Britain**

European country made up of England, Scotland, and Wales; homeland of British people

#### **Great Depression**

a catastrophic economic breakdown that spanned the 1930s and affected millions of people in the United States and countries throughout the world

#### **Great Migration**

the journey of African Americans from the rural South to live in cities in the North and West

#### hemisphere

half of a sphere; half of Earth

#### hemp

a plant with a tough woody fiber used to make rope, clothing, or paper

#### heritage

the background and traditions of a person or group that are handed down from one generation to the next

#### history

the story of what happened in the past

#### human resource

a person who produces goods and/or provides services

#### immigrant

a person who moves to another country to live

#### import

a good purchased and brought in from another state or country

#### impressment

the act of taking US sailors from their ships and forcing them to work for the British Navy

#### income

the money a person earns by working; salary

#### income tax

the portion of money a worker must pay to the government out of what he or she earns

#### indigenous

the first people born or living in a place, as well as their descendents

#### industrialization

conversion (change) from an economy based on growing things to an economy based on manufacturing

#### industry

a business or group of businesses that provides goods or services

#### influence

to cause a change without directly forcing it

#### interest

the money banks pay a person for using that person's money

#### intermediate directions

directions on a compass halfway between cardinal directions: northeast, northwest southeast, southwest

#### intermodal shipping

a system of moving products using a combination of methods, such as semitrucks transporting containers to rail cars or rail cars transporting containers to boats or barges

#### **International Date Line**

an imaginary line; the longitude line opposite the prime meridian; 180° longitude (180 degrees)

#### interpret

understand or make meaning of something

#### interracial

involving people of different races

#### intervals

the evenly-spaced periods of time on a timeline

#### issue

an important matter or problem that affects people and their communities

#### judicial branch

the branch of government that interprets laws passed by the legislative branch

#### jury

a group of people who listen to all the facts of a court case and make a decision

#### labor union

an organization of workers united to achieve certain goals

#### **laborer**

a worker, employee, human resource

#### **Land Law**

a law stating that a person may purchase vacant land for a specified price

#### land warrant

a certificate from the land office allowing a person to possess a specific piece of public land

#### latitude

an imaginary horizontal line that indicates distance north or south of the Equator

#### legislative branch

the branch of government that creates laws

#### loan

money given to a person who promises to pay it back

#### location

where a place is

#### lock

a structure on a river that holds or releases water, thereby raising or lowering boats

#### long hunters

hunters who came to Kentucky and stayed for a full hunting season in order to make a profit

#### longhouse

a Native-American home made of logs built to hold large families of 6 or more

#### longitude

an imaginary vertical line that indicates distance east or west of the prime meridian

#### manufacture

to make large amounts of a product to sell

#### map scale

a graphic that helps the reader determine the distance between two places

#### market

a place people come to buy and sell goods

#### mechanization

the use of machines to do the work that humans and animals once did

#### militia

a group of citizens who serve as soldiers when needed; individuals who are not part of the country's regular armed forces

#### model

a three-dimensional item that represents something in a realistic way

#### mound builders

people from ancient times who built rounded earthen hills for religious, ceremonial, and burial purposes

#### mountaintop mining

exposing coal by exploding mountains, so the coal is forced above ground and then taken out

#### natural resource

a supply found in nature that is useful or valuable to people

#### needs

the things people must have to survive: food, water, shelter, air

#### neutral

supporting neither side in a disagreement or conflict; unbiased

#### **New Deal**

a series of programs to help Americans rebuild the economy during the Great Depression

#### nomad

a person who travels from place to place and does not have a permanent home

#### **North Pole**

the northernmost latitude; 90° (90 degrees) North

#### oath

a promise

#### **Paleo-Indians**

ancient people; the first ones to live in Kentucky

#### pelt

the skin of an animal, with or without the fur

#### physical feature

a natural feature found on Earth, such as a landform or waterway

#### physical map

a map that shows Earth's geological features (landforms) and elevation

#### pie graph

a circular chart divided into sections of varying sizes; each section represents part of the whole

#### place

a specific area or block of space

#### plantation

a huge farm, often found in the Southern states, that grows cash crops such as cotton, sugar, tobacco, and rice

#### plantation economy

a system in which the owners of large Southern farms used slave labor to grow cash crops for profit

#### plaza

a public square or open place in a city or town; often a place with much activity

#### political map

a map that shows boundaries created by people; includes regions, countries, states, cities, and towns

#### political party

an organized group of like-minded people who work together to win elections and control the government

#### population

the number of people living in a certain area; the inhabitants of a particular town, area, or country

#### posterity

the future generations of people

#### poverty line

the lowest income a person can earn and still be able to pay for food, shelter, and clothing

#### prehistoric

the time before writing or written records

#### primary source

a first-hand account told by someone who was present at an event; may include letters, logs, journals, government documents, maps, and speeches

#### prime meridian

zero degrees  $(0^{\circ})$  longitude; the starting point for measuring east and west using lines of longitude

#### producer

a person or company that makes goods or provides services

#### productive resource

a natural resource, human resource, or capital resource needed to produce goods

#### profit

the money earned after all expenses (costs) have been paid

#### ratify

officially approve; legal approval of a document such as a treaty, law, or constitutional amendment

#### raw material

a substance in its natural form that can be manufactured into a new product

#### region

an area with common features

#### relative location

a location described by its relationship to neighboring objects or places

#### representative

a person who speaks for others

#### representative democracy

government in which citizens choose their leaders by voting; the type of government the United States has

#### right to assemble

the right of people to gather peacefully in groups

#### right to petition the government

the right to request that the government correct something unfair or wrong; address a concern by asking others to sign a document supporting a change

#### **Royal Proclamation of 1763**

a law prohibiting colonists from settling west of the Appalachian Mountains

#### rural

an area away from the city with natural countryside and/or open land for farming and ranching

#### salary

regular pay; money a person earns by doing work

#### savings

money put aside to use in the future

#### scarcity

not enough to meet the demand for a resource, good, or service; a shortage

#### secede

leave; break away

#### secondary source

a text or object that is not a first-hand account but uses a primary source for information about an event

#### sediment

bits of sand, silt, and clay that settle to the bottom of a body of water

#### segregation

separation of people or things; separation based on race

#### service

what workers do for other people in exchange for pay (car repair, medical care, music lessons, etc.)

#### sharecropper

one who farms another person's land and pays for the use of that land by giving a portion of the crops to the landowner

#### smallpox

a deadly virus that infected Native Americans; brought to America by Europeans

#### social

having to do with people and how they interact with one another

#### social studies

the study of history, government, geography, economics, and culture

#### **South Pole**

the southernmost latitude; 90° (90 degrees) South

#### span

an amount of time from beginning to end

#### squatter

a person who lives and works on land without officially owning it

#### station

two or more cabins built close together for the protection of settlers on the Kentucky frontier

#### stockade

a protective fence made from logs or posts placed close together, often surrounding a fort

#### strike

an organized effort in which employees refuse to work in order to force a change

#### strip mining

using heavy machinery to scrape off layers of soil and rock in order to take out the coal buried underneath

#### subsistence farming

a system of farming that provides only what the farm family needs with little left over for sale

#### supply

the natural resources, goods, or services that are available

#### surface mining

harvesting coal at the surface of the Earth rather than digging mines to extract it

#### survey

to measure the size, shape, and position of a piece of land

#### surveyor

one who measures land, locates property boundaries, and helps create maps

#### sustainable practice

a way of doing things today so that people can meet their needs in the future

#### symbol

an object or picture that represents something else

#### table

a chart that shows information in rows and columns

#### taxation without representation

a practice in which the government taxes citizens without giving them a chance to vote or give input

#### tectonic plates

layers of Earth's crust that move, float, and sometimes fracture

#### term

a fixed period of time an elected official serves

#### timeline

a listing of events (vertically or horizontally) in the order they happened

#### toll

a fee charged to pass over a bridge or use a section of road

#### tranquility

a state of peace, agreement, or getting along well

#### treason

the act of betraying or working against one's country

#### treaty

a written agreement between two or more groups

#### trestle

a structure, often made of wood, that supports raised train tracks or bridges

#### unalienable

impossible to take away or be denied

#### Union

the United States of America

#### veto

the power to reject legislation, or a decision made by a law-making body

#### wants

the items or services people would like to have but do not need to survive

#### Warrior's Path

a path through Kentucky used by Native Americans for hunting and by Europeans for travel; links the Ohio River with the Cumberland Gap

#### weathering

the breaking up and wearing away of rock and soil by wind and water

# Help Pages Glossary

#### wigwam

a Native-American home with a rounded shape, made with sticks and covered with tree bark and animal skins

#### World War I (WWI)

a four-year conflict involving many countries, much destruction, and a great loss of life (1914–1918)

#### World War II (WWII)

a second major conflict (after WWI) involving many countries; caused the greatest amount of property damage and killed more people than any previous war (1939–1945)









# **United States Regions Map**
