## Map Skills: Using a Grid

A grid is another way to help you find places on a map. A grid has vertical lines (going up and down) and horizontal lines (going side to side). The lines make boxes.

Use the grid to find Sarah's House.

- Put one finger on letter B and another finger on number 4.
- Bring both fingers together to meet at Sarah's House.
- Sarah's House is at B-4 on the grid.
