

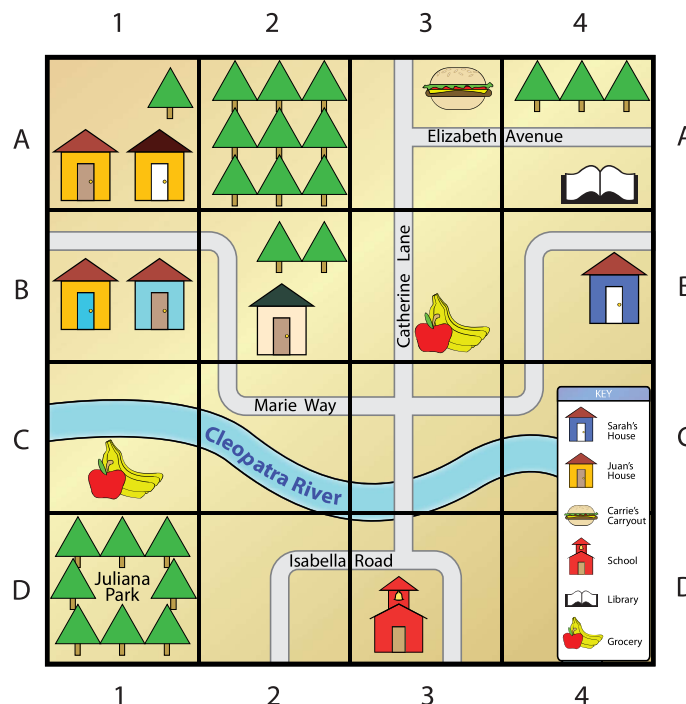
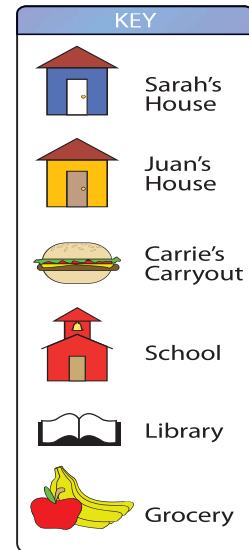
Sample Lesson #1

Map Skills: Using a Grid

A **grid** is another way to help you find places on a map. A grid has **vertical** lines (going up and down) and **horizontal** lines (going side to side). The lines make boxes.

Use the **grid** to find Sarah's House.

- Put one finger on letter B and another finger on number 4.
- Bring both fingers together to meet at Sarah's House.
- Sarah's House is at B-4 on the grid.
