
Statue of Liberty

Citizens know a place by its landmarks (important buildings, statues, or objects). The White House and the Statue of Liberty are American landmarks.

The Statue of Liberty is a monument on an island in New York Harbor. A **monument** is an object built to remember a person or event. France gave the copper statue to the United States in 1885 as a symbol of freedom. This large gift sailed to the



United States in 350 pieces. The United States built a **pedestal** (base) for the statue. The Statue of Liberty has welcomed people to the United States for more than 100 years.
