

Graphic Organizers: Flowcharts

Flowcharts are graphic organizers that show steps, stages, or phases that occur one after another. A flowchart displays a series of items in sequential order and may be used for chain-of-events maps, cause-effect charts, or directions for putting something together. A flowchart usually has a clear starting point, and then arrows or lines show how one event leads to the next. Some examples of flowcharts that you have probably used are diagrams of the water cycle or rock cycle, dichotomous keys, family tree charts, and story sequencing charts. An example is shown here. This flowchart shows the process that high school students might use to solve problems with the help of their student council.
